Rachel's House provides services for homeless women in downtown San Diego. KCC provides one meal a month for their night shelter.



## Help Our International Partner, The Cambodian Village Fund, furnish their new Dormitory in Battambang, Cambodia



The Cambodian Village Fund (CVF) and KCC have been partnering for years in the work to advocate for education and human rights in rural Cambodia.

CVF has undertaken a massive project to provide safe housing for the young women who are getting their college education in Battambang, Cambodia through the scholarship program. KCC has already donated \$500 in support of this project. But we thought YOU might want to make your own donation.

The new dormitory is a gorgeous building and will be a safe and wonderful home for the scholarship girls for generations to come. Construction of the dormitory is CVF's biggest project so far. And we are so proud of the amazing work they are doing in rural Cambodia!

There are two ways to help furnish the dorm:

### **Option 1:**

Any donation, large or small, helps the Cambodian Village Fund buy one or two pieces of furniture.

- Bunkbed (we need 12) \$370 each
- Mattress (we need 24) \$45 each
- Cabinet (we need 12) \$800 each
- Desk (we need 12) \$35 each
- Lamp (we need 24) \$22 each
- Fan (we need 12) \$47 each
- Stove/Oven \$566
- Washing Machine \$445

### **Option 2:**

Donate \$3,000 and have a room named after you!

There is a great opportunity to become part of the dormitory's legacy. If you buy a complete room of furniture, the room will be named after you with an engraved plaque on the door.

There are six rooms. Furniture for each room costs \$3,000.

## KCC Faith Formation Update

This summer, KCC Faith Formation is meeting the children and youth in nature for large group outdoor Sunday School classes. Each week we are visiting a different park in San Diego. The change in scenery leads to varied experiences each Sunday including different games and unique opportunities for play.



Last Sunday we got soaked with water balloons, played on the playground structure, and talked about justice for our LGBT brothers and sisters while cooling off in a gazebo at Chollas Lake. Unfortunately, the lake was not an easy place for us to access as a large group, but we had a great view from the gazebo.



Here are some highlights:

- The battery-operated “hot potato” plastic ball that holds a water balloon was a hit.
- Not surprisingly, the old-fashioned water balloon toss was almost as much fun as hot potato and we wished we had more water balloons to repeat the games.
- Tucked between the Gloria Mesa Playground and the lake is a wonderful gazebo that provided shade while we cooled off and ate frozen Go-Gurts.

Each week, the group includes three-year old’s through 19-year old’s and the Youth Group lends a hand to play with the children and lead activities. Last Sunday, over and over again, the youth demonstrated kindness, love and patience when leading, teaching, and playing with the children. And the children—who showed up ready to play and move—oftentimes did not recognize their old nursery and Sunday School friends at first, preferring the youth as playmates. By the end of the class, the children were playing with their peers like old friends again.



It is in the spirit of these small moments of pure delight and loving kindness that I offer you a window into the summer program. As we move into another phase of discernment while planning the new program for the fall, I will continue to provide updates for you in the Chimes. I hope you are enjoying your summer!
